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Haagse Strandhuisjes - The Beach Houses of The Hague

Welcome to the Haagse Strandhuisjes, an idyllic beachside retreat in The Hague (Den Haag). Located at Strandslag 2a, these charming beach houses offer a unique seaside experience. Strandslag, meaning 'beach entrance', serves as your gateway to the sandy shores, with a path leading through picturesque dunes.

The Hague boasts 12 such entrances, each with its own character, but Strandslag 2a stands out for its delightful beach houses. Available for rent during the summer, these cozy abodes provide a perfect haven for a refreshing beach holiday. Immerse yourself in the local beach culture, feel the sea breeze, and enjoy the relaxed ambiance of this coastal gem.

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Hemelgewelf, Kijkduin - Celestial Vault, Kijkduin

Enter the realm of the Celestial Vault, or 'Het Hemels Gewelf', a unique artistic creation by American artist James Turrell, located in Kijkduin. This intriguing structure is a crater approximately 30 by 40 meters in size, encircled by a 5-meter high embankment. Accessible through a short tunnel after ascending a hill, the Celestial Vault offers a mesmerizing experience. In its center lies a natural stone bench. Lying here, you gaze directly into the sky, transformed into a dynamic dome of shifting clouds and light, ever-changing due to its proximity to the sea. Created in 1996 and renovated in 2008, this installation invites you to witness the sky's ethereal beauty in a new light.

De Vulkaan - The Volcano

Discover 'De Vulkaan', a hidden gem offering panoramic views over The Hague's coastline and cityscape. While not an actual volcano, this vantage point presents a breathtaking perspective of the surrounding area. Facing the sea, to your right, the famous Scheveningen beach unfolds, identifiable by its iconic ferris wheel. To the left, the industrial landscape of Hoek van Holland presents a stark contrast with its cranes and windmills. Turning away from the sea, the skyline of The Hague's city center emerges, home to many of the nation's ministries. This lookout point remains relatively undiscovered even by local residents, making it a serene spot to appreciate the diverse views that define The Hague.
