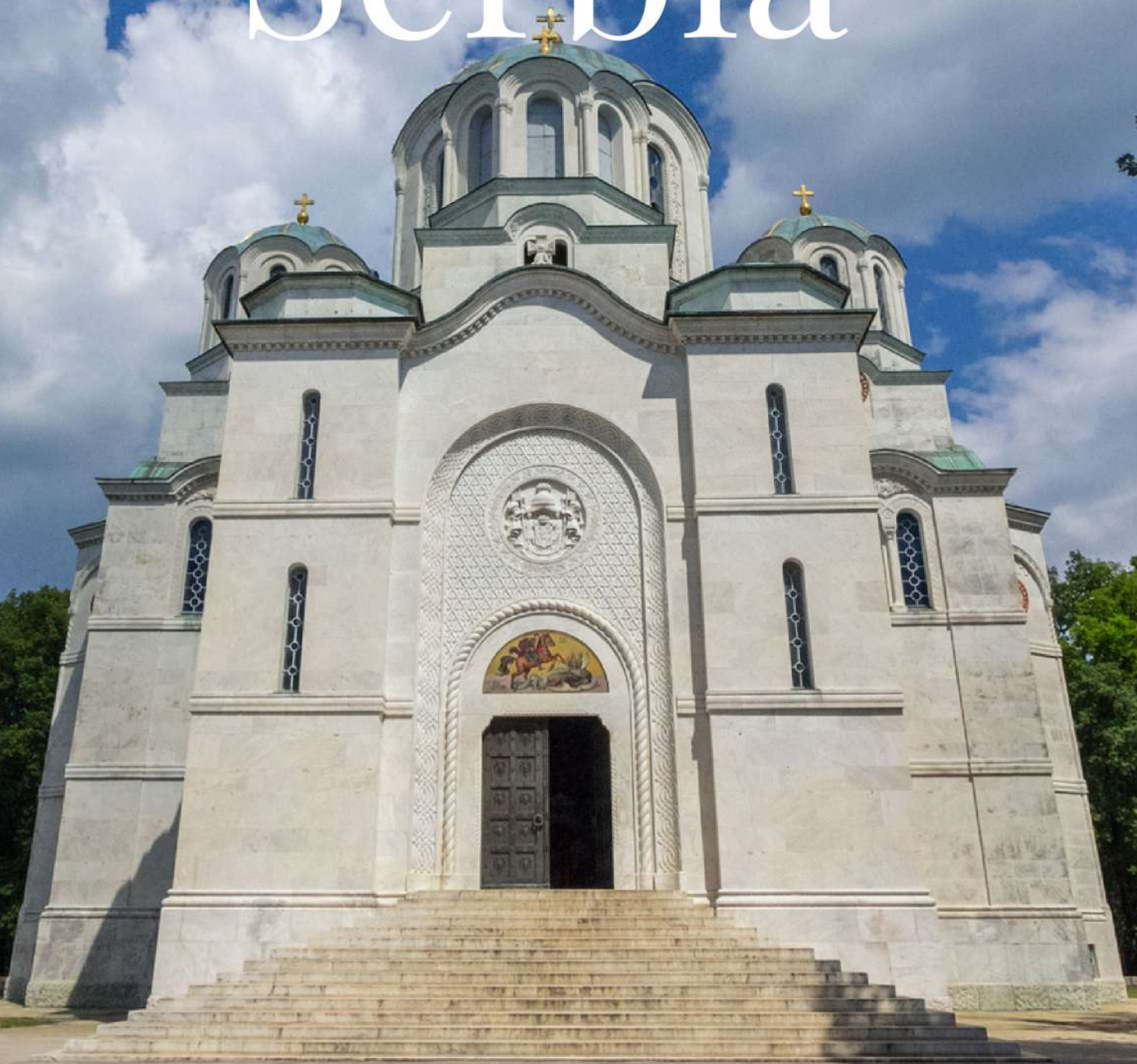

## *Church of St. George: An Oplenac Crown Jewel*
